2020 Annual Spending Plan (Budget) Resolution:

With intentional effort to be good stewards of the gifts received, the Ministry groups and Parish staff have submitted budget requests to the Finance/Stewardship ministry who then made adjustments and presented a proposed budget of \$815,000 to the congregation council. This budget was unanimously approved by the council at the meeting on December 19, 2019. The congregation council recommends and requests that this budget be adopted as the 2020 Operational Spending Plan (Budget) by the voting members at this January 26, 2020 Annual Meeting. Additionally, the congregation of Saint Andrew Lutheran Church shall recommit themselves to any additional gifts and offerings in 2020 as may be required to support any non-budgeted needs for the 2020 program year.

40th Anniversary Plans for 2020

Pastor Emeritus Resolution:

Saint Andrew Lutheran Church has been sustained by the Holy Spirit these last 40 years. Planted in Rib Moutain by the Lutheran Church in America in the year 1980, thousands of souls have been nurtured and inspired through the effective and compassionate leadership and pastoral care of Pastor John Roseth who faithfully served Saint Andrew as mission developer and pastor for 32 years.

Saint Andrew grew throughout the years into a vital and vibrant Christ centered community and ministry that has served the greater Wausau area with a unique mission and vision to be "open to all" therefore Saint Andrew seeks to renew this legacy looking to cast a vision and mission for the next 40 years and beyond.
