### **WORSHIP WORD**

Today, we have hard readings set before us. Deuteronomy is Moses giving the people a choice to follow the God who freed them from slavery in Egypt, or they could go their own way worship their own Gods. Paul, insults those who quarrel without consideration given to what they were fighting about. Jesus has the audacity to condemn to hell all who get angry, lust after others, get divorced, or even swear oaths. It seems we get to choose between life and death, but despite our best intentions, our actions lead away from God and towards death.

What options are left open to us?

Yet, we have hope, too, within these passages. We are never told we have to do this alone. In fact, just last week Jesus told us that he fulfilled the laws that Moses was encouraging the people to hold to. Paul encourages the Corinthians in their common purpose as a field grown by God, and Jesus tells us that reconciliation is the preparation for our life with God. While we may not have the ability to do this on our own, we have the church, the Body of Christ, the power of the Holy Spirit, and the love of God on which we can rely for strength to do the hard work of reconciliation.

#### **DEVOTIONS**



Read: Matthew 5:21-37.

These words from Jesus can seem difficult to accept, even scary. Jesus is doing two basic things. He is presenting himself as an authorized interpreter of God's law ("but I say to you") and he is refuting a use of the law that allows people to abuse others. Jesus points out that not killing and not committing adultery carries with them the commitment to value another person's life beyond not killing or divorcing someone. God's law protects life, all life. That means people's reputations, relationships with others, and ability to live daily in peace is valued by God. God cares about all of life. Jesus' hyperbole about plucking out one's eye or cutting off one's hand is a tool of wisdom speech. It makes a point that the intent of God's law is so very important because God's gift of life is that important. And Jesus—like no other—is authorized to state this point in the face of scribes, Pharisees, and all the learned teachers of the law. How do you see God's law as a gift to protect you and your neighbor?

*Pray:* Lord Jesus, you teach us that the greatest law is to love God and neighbor. Help us to live lives that love you and all people. Amen.

# SERVICE



God's law is meant to protect life, which is the theme this week throughout the Daily Bible Readings. The Christian response to Jesus' teachings is to love God and neighbor through actions and words. Think about and act upon what this means to you. Is there a congregation or organization near you that would benefit from a financial contribution or your volunteer time to provide a needed service for others?

# **RITUALS AND TRADITIONS**



The reading from 1 Corinthians 3 this week reminds us that "we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building" (v.9). Gather together a few toy building blocks or boxes. Read 1 Corinthians 3:1-9. Build a tower one block at a time. Each time you add a block, name ways we grow in our faith: e.g., worship, prayer, singing, or reading Scripture. After the tower is built, use these practices to grow in your faith this week.
