New Normal.

New Normal's require new practices, new devotions, new prayers, new songs. That new song, once found, is more precious than the old, because through the search we found the true treasure that we thought was lost, but never was.

And, when we sing it Easter feels like Easter again, because it always was.



Ways to Give

With the church building closed and services being conducted remotely, several members have asked how they can still make their offerings. There are a number of ways you can make your offerings to Saint



Andrew. Hopefully you can find a method that works for you.

- *Mail an envelope to church at 150202 County Road NN, Wausau WI 54401
- *Send a text message to 715-800-2369 with the amount you would like to contribute. Within a few minutes you will be sent a text with a link to register. Click on the link and enter your cardholder name and debit or credit card information. Once your registration is complete, you will receive a text verification and a receipt of your contribution via email.
- *Sign up for TOE (Transfer Offering Electronically). It's as simple as calling the church office a call with your bank information.
- *Use the online system through the church website (www.salc-wausau.org). Click on the "Giving" tab near the top on the home page and select "Online Giving". Set up a profile with a password and complete the required banking information. You can then set up a direct debit to your checking or savings account to make your contribution. You can also use a credit card, but then fees are deducted from your contribution. It can be set up to make a fixed amount each week or each month on the date you choose. You can change the amount or date at any time by going back into the system.
- *Use the Bill Pay feature on the On-Line Banking System offered by your financial institution to send an on-going or one-time electronic payment to Saint Andrew. Not all banks may be able to do this. This gives you the option to change the amount every month, stop the payment for a month or two, or stop using this method and going to another.

Wausau Warming Center Current Needs

The Wausau Warming Center is still open during this critical time of Safer at Home order and currently have several guests using the facility. If you would like to help, monetary gifts are needed at this time to provide the noon meals, which are being purchased each day from local businesses. Any monetary donations can be sent to Catholic Charities, 540 S. 3rd Ave., with a notation that it is for the Warming Center/Meals. They are also in need of any board games, DVD's, or magazines for guests to use at this time. These items can be brought to the YWCA, 615 N. 5th St., Wausau between the hours of 6 am and 6 pm. Just knock on the door and then place the item on the bench outside the door. If you would like your items returned to you, please put your name and phone number on them. What does bulk mean? It means buying 6 bags of the same coffee or tea or a dozen of the same chocolate bar. For orders over \$75, shipping is free. For orders under \$75, shipping is \$7.50.
