# Network Note from Pr. Jenn

I have come to value the question "How are you doing?" in new ways. I sincerely want to know and sincerely hear care and compassion when people ask that question of me. One of our hopes during this challenging season in our life together is that we all can answer that question and be well — even as we find life to be ever changing and somewhat stressful.

To answer the question, "How are you?" I would share that I am well. Many in my "framily" are deemed essential workers who are risking their own health for care of others. That sometimes gets me down. But for the most part, I am adapting to work from home and the task of keeping church running smoothly. I have asthma so have been extra careful around social distancing. My cat might be found under the definition of "clingy" in the dictionary...a reality I quite enjoy.

"How are we?" I've got some updates to share with you and the staff has put together some resources for you in this special edition Network and also on our Saint Andrew Facebook page. Here are a few notes about what has transpired in the last week.

With Governor Evers' order to stay "safer at home," we have also taken precaution at Saint Andrew and the office has formally closed which means that we are asking people without any direct reason to be in the building to not be there unless the need is crucial to essential functions. AA has decided to meet via zoom and information is posted on our West entrance for anyone who may need that. The staff are working from home and are in frequent contact with me. Most days, Monday through Friday, at various times, one of us will be present on site to collect mail and check messages. Many thanks to you who have mailed in your offerings. We are receiving them and they have been vitally important in this time of uncertainty. Offerings will continue to be processed as usual on Mondays.

Pastor Justin is officially "off" this week as he helps his family conclude the move from Indiana, returning to Wausau with his wife, Pastor Phyllis. When he returns he will join us and the rest of the staff as we work our way through a rather substantial directory to be in touch with as many of you as possible via phone. Our staff along with a few volunteers will be calling you from their personal numbers and it will take some time to get to all of you since there are over 900 family units in our congregation. The goal of these calls is just to check in. We are assessing the needs of people in our community and want to make sure you have the care that you need to make it through this time.

We will continue to stream worship live from church and can feel your presence as you join us. We are thankful that Governor Evers' order lists weddings, funerals, and religious entities in section 13.h as essential. But there are limits. No more than 10 people are to be in a room and individuals are to adhere to social distancing. On Wednesday and Sunday you will likely see the pastors and the accompanist in the livestream. We will do this as long as we are feeling well and can be present in person.

You will find our Facebook page has lots of resources that we will continue to update, and we plan to e-mail more frequent versions of the network via constant contact. If you haven't done so, please "like" our Facebook page to be cued into the most recent updates.

Thanks to all of you who are doing your part to stay safe at home. Thanks to all who are living out their faith with courage as you report to work on the front lines of grocery stores, the streets of the Wausau/Metro area, and at places like Aspirus and Saint Clare. You are continually in our thoughts and prayers. We pray for your health and wellbeing and that you may continue to answer the question, "How are you?" with the words, "I am well" – or something similar.

As always, thank you for sharing these updates with those who may not have internet.

# COMMUNION PRACTICES - TRUST IN THE WORD

*Our bishop, Bishop Jerry Mansholt* of the East Central Synod of Wisconsin wrote to the pastors and deacons of our synod with his wisdom on what we should do surrounding communion practices during this time. He writes:

A few of you have asked for guidance on the practice of Holy Communion, especially in light of some emerging practices in different parts of the Church. I know the reception of Holy Communion has become a very central part of our worship life. I myself was a strong advocate for and introduced the weekly celebration of the eucharist in every congregation I served from the beginning of my ministry onward. I give thanks to God for the centrality of the Eucharist in our weekly Sunday worship. There are good and worthy reasons to celebrate the Holy Meal on the day of Christ's resurrection.

I cringe, however, when I hear someone say that worship is incomplete without the Holy Communion or that people are not being fed without the Meal. It is important for us to remember Holy Communion is not separate from the Word, not some special food we must eat to fully know and receive God. The sacraments are a means of grace, the Word coming to the believer in water, bread and wine.

Jesus Christ is the Word of God incarnate. The proclamation of God's message to us as both Law and Gospel is the Word of God. The canonical Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the written Word of God. I have heard some powerful proclamations of the Word in your online worship services. You need to know and trust the Word you are proclaiming is bringing comfort and assurance to the hearts and souls of the people you serve.

I watched and listened to several worship services from around the synod these past two Sundays. I also tuned in early this past Sunday and heard Cardinal Dolan's homily from St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City. I was struck by how he connected the tactile aspects of Jesus ministry with the man blind from birth (John 9) with the communal nature of Holy Communion. He noted how Jesus spat, made mud and touched the man's eyes bringing forth sight. Then the Cardinal noted how the community gathers in Jesus' name. There in the gathered community is the sharing of peace, the physical presence of one another, and placing of bread in the hand of the communicant.

I am so thankful for online meetings, especially in these days of working from home. But while I immensely enjoy seeing faces on the screen, they remain a virtual presence. I love seeing my children and grandchildren when doing Facetime and talking with them and hearing their voices. But I long to hug them and to be in their physical presence. The sacrament of Holy Communion is deeply connected liturgically to incarnational theology and Jesus' presence in the community of believers. I think there are many questions yet to be explored about the nature of community vis a vis the technology of this age. It is also a time for us to think deeply about how the Word of God comes to us and how we receive that Word.

So my recommendation and counsel is that we trust in the power of the proclamation of the Word and not engage in practices like online communion at this time. Holy Communion is not the only way the Word of God is communicated, not even the preeminent way that the Word of God is communicated. Furthermore, when we are anxious and deeply concerned about so many things, I don't think this is the best time to be making decisions of this magnitude. I also know there are pastors and congregations who have experimented with distributing communion from the parking lot or making the sacrament available in other ways. Though I confess to my own reservations about some of these practices, there also is part of me that admires the bold innovation and desire to serve. But now in these days of Safer at Home, I encourage a fasting from Holy Communion. Let us do all that we can to maintain safe physical distances between people lest we contribute to the spread of the coronavirus. I speak this word to all of you with humility, knowing others around the Church are wrestling with these matters but coming to different conclusions. I encourage us all to be gentle with one another, to listen, study and think deeply, and pray about these matters. And let us trust the Holy Spirit is at work through our proclamation of the Good News of God in Jesus Christ and working faith and love in all of us.
