Paul and the Church in Corinth, Take 2

The Corinthians forgot about Paul.

The city of Corinth was situated on an isthmus between Athens and Sparta. A hub of trade, ships would save time by transferring cargo across the land. There are even paths where they would drag ships across the land to set sail on the far side. Corinth also saw travelers from all over the world walk its streets. Temples and shrines to the Roman gods and gods from all over the world served the cosmopolitan population of the city. Paul saw that such a cosmopolitan place and an economic center was perfect for a church.

Yet, after departing from Corinth to continue his mission and ministry around the Roman world, problems arose in the church. When word reached Paul, he reminded them of the power of the Gospel in First Corinthians. Then after a painful visit and a tearful letter, the Corinthians were ready to reconcile and what we find in Second Corinthians is the reconciliation that God worked in the lives of Paul and the Corinthians.

These letters were not from Paul to a Corinthian, but to the entire community, so whenever you hear/read the word "you", the Greek reads "you all."

We will be spending six weeks with Paul and the Corinthians as they build their relationship again based on the fallibility of humanity. Unlike Job, the story is hidden in the subtext of both letters, so rather than a clear story, we have themes for the readings each week.

Week 1: Consolation (1:1-11) Week 2: Forgiveness (2:1-10)

Week 3: Treasure in Clay Jars (4:1-15)

Week 4: We Walk by Faith, Not by Sight (4:16-5:10)

Week 5: Reconciliation (5:11-21)

Week 6: Generosity (8:1-15)

I encourage you to read between and around the texts for each week to get the full picture of the letter and relationship between Paul and our brothers and sisters in Corinth. And a potential pathway for you to work towards rebuilding the relationships in your lives.

Discussions are taking place to achieve a deep cleaning of the building and the possibility of experimenting with an outdoor service is also being explored.
