In keeping with our current criteria, the task force recommended the following statement that was then approved and adopted by council on November 19:

In the spirit of Love, born to us in the Christ child, the pastors and staff, the Plan to Gather Task Force, and the Church Council at Saint Andrew Lutheran Church are committed to sharing the gospel safely and abundantly in these difficult times. As a large congregation with over 3000 members, we are partners in public health and have set the goal that Saint Andrew will not be a source of community spread. We recognize we cannot fulfill our mission to be "open to all" if the vulnerable and the visitor is not fully welcome in worship among us. We are equipped to support members in their life-long faith journeys through virtual and innovative means. Therefore this Christmas, we will worship together in our homes as a sign of love for the community we have been called to serve.

"I'll Be Home for Christmas - Online Worship" will take place at www.facebook.com/salcwausau on Christmas Eve at 6:30 and 10:30 pm (note that this is a corrected time which was previously printed as 9:30 pm) and on Christmas Day at 9:00 am.

I'm looking forward to connecting with you: online or by phone for now, and then—through God at work through medicine and public health and all of us, too—face to face.

This week finds me in four days of new bishop formation with the Conference of Bishops and also getting ready to move to Appleton! We will close on both houses December 11 and are grateful as you pray us through this transition. I have started a facebook page--@BishopAnneEA--and will work with Jeanne Jerks on ideas for using that page, the synod facebook page, and the Bishop's blog for regular communication and online community interaction. Especially right now, but beyond the pandemic, too, I am grateful for the ways that congregations and all expressions of the church are finding creative and meaningful



I'm very grateful to be working with Pastor Amy Engebose and the synod staff to offer a pre-recorded worship service for Sunday, December 27th. The narrative of Jesus' family bringing him to the temple, where they encounter faithful elders Simeon and Anna, is poignant in these days of limited in-person cross-generational connection. In your waiting, watching, preparations and ministry, may God's peace in Jesus Christ find you, be with you, be tangible to you, and connect you with God's people and all creation in surprising ways.
