Those attending are asked to park facing the hospital following every other in parking spaces, turn on emergency flashers, stay in vehicles, and tune your radio to 89Q. At 7pm local pastors will lead a group prayer on 89Q, participants will sing two Christmas Carols, and end with a "honk of hope" for the staff and patients.

Centered in the gospel story from Luke 2, four diverse opportunities will be shared through the Saint Andrew live stream between Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. Following a virtual Christmas pageant at 4:00 pm, led by over 22 individuals and family units, the following three worship services will include the chance to commune and experience different leadership, sermons, and worship content.

In addition to the livestream, **Communion** will be available to be received following the 6:30 pm worship service from 7:30 pm-8:30 pm by driving up to the north Chapel doors. Simply remain in your car and Pr. Jenn, Pr. Justin, or a communion assistant will bring communion to your car and share words of blessing.

While you do not need to have a Facebook account to watch along, it helps if you do have one to follow the page which will allow for you to get alerts and updates. Each livestream, with exception to the 4:00 pm service, will begin approximately fifteen minutes prior to the scheduled time to allow for people to gather.

Christmas Statement

In keeping with our current criteria, the task force recommended the following statement that was then approved and adopted by council on November 19:

In the spirit of Love, born to us in the Christ child, the pastors and staff, the Plan to Gather Task Force, and the Church Council at Saint Andrew Lutheran Church are committed to sharing the gospel safely and abundantly in these difficult times. As a large congregation with over 3000 members, we are partners in public health and have set the goal that Saint Andrew will not be a source of community spread. We recognize we cannot fulfill our mission to be "open to all" if the vulnerable and the visitor is not fully welcome in worship among us. We are equipped to support members in their life-long faith journeys through virtual and innovative means. Therefore this Christmas, we will worship together in our homes as a sign of love for the community we have been called to serve.
