The disciples are so relatable. I imagine their furrowed brows raised while they say, "huh?" at Jesus' words and actions. There is a small story in Luke 9 beginning with verse 51. A Samaritan village refuses to receive Jesus because of his mission to go to Jerusalem – to the cross.

James and John ask, "Do you want us to command fire to come down from heaven and consume them?" We don't have dialogue; all we know is that Jesus doesn't answer their question. He just turns and rebukes them. That is it. Then they go on to another village.

How do we heal the division in the world? Is it even possible that the gap between opposing viewpoints could grow smaller? Here's how that happens: love. That's it. Small moments of love – seeing them, creating them, focusing on them. I can't rain down fire (and I don't really want to). I can't preach a sermon the world will hear. There's no law that will fix division. No political leader. Love is the only option. Little and big love is how this world is mended.

To look someone in the eye and say thank you. To admit that you don't understand but want to. To look at the person at the dinner table as a gift and not a burden or a threat. This is where the gap closes between us. Christ working in and through broken hearts is where the healing begins. Christ has no body now but mine. He prays in me, works in me, looks through my eyes, speaks through my words, works through my hands, walks with my feet, and loves with my heart.
