Sacred Space for Sundays

Since we are going to practice virtual communion for the duration of the season of Lent, I would like to share a practice that one of our members uses to deepen the experience. Creating a sacred space can help make your experience of worship. Just as we set the table in worship prior to communion, so too can you set for table for this formal event.



Here is an example of such a space. Bruce and Linda Beyer have been gracious enough to share how they prepare for virtual communion. They have a cross and a candle, which are items that we have in the sanctuary. The light of the flame has been a symbol of the presence of God since the Ark of the Covenant was kept in the Tabernacle in the wilderness, the lights on the lampstand were lit. The cross has been the focal point of Christian worship for generations. The other items, beginning from the left are glasses for the juice, which were from an Alaskan Cruise, and a bread plate that was table decorations from a wedding. These are for holding the elements prior to the Eucharistic liturgy. The die, the nail, the tear, and the bag are from an old Sunday school lesson. They all are part of Jesus' passion and death. The nail that pierced him, the bag of silver that we the price of betrayal, the die soldiers used to cast lots for Jesus' clothes, and the tears that were shed by Mary and John at the foot of the cross (or Jesus' own tears of agony). The cloth on the right is a stole for when Bruce would officiate in less formal settings.

These items, intentionally gathered, create a unique space to remember that we are gathered around the presence of the crucified and risen Christ, even when we are in our homes.

This is something that you can do as well. A white cloth is a good place to start, it does not have to be a stole, but just a cloth that gives the space a clean and simple look. Place the other items on top of the cloth. A cross, a candle, a hymnal or Bible, previous year's Lent tokens, and a few other items that have a special meaning to you in your journey of faith can be placed on the cloth along with the celebration cup. Don't clutter the space, but give it meaning for you and your family. For the season of Lent, purple is a color that you will see in worship a lot because it reminds us of the royal status of Jesus, enthroned on a cross. It would be appropriate to include this color in you sacred space.

Keeping this space up throughout the season of Lent, especially in the place where you participate in the livestream, will be a discipline that will shape your journey this season.

Created for Community – Lent at Saint Andrew

The invitation to Lent spoken on Ash Wednesday reminds us that we enter this season together "with the whole church" because "we are created for communion with God, to love



one another, and to live in harmony with creation."

Though many common Lenten practices rightly invite us to individual acts of "repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love," Lent is also a time for deepening of community relationships with one another and our neighbors.

Especially in this time of feeling further apart from one another, isolated, and socially distant, Christ calls us to be

sewn into the quilt together – an array of patches with different patterns, shapes and sizes. Using readings from Mark's gospel, we invite you to reflect on what it means to be in community with one another, with the world, with creation, and with God. Here is an overview of what you can expect this Lent:

- We will kick off Lent with a live-stream worship on *Ash Wednesday at 6:30 pm*. You can participate in this as you would any Sunday morning live-stream.
- "Created for Community" bags are available which include ashes to-go and a blessing to share with your family and friends for Ash Wednesday, communion elements for each Sunday in Lent, Lent tokens, and a Lent devotional booklet.
- We will worship together in a new format, over Zoom, on Wednesdays in Lent beginning *February 24 at 6:30 pm*. If you would rather join via the live-stream on Facebook, you can do that as well and engage through the chat.
- Soup for Community! is launching to provide the Lenten soup you love "to go." It will be available for pre-order on-line and by calling the office. Each week it is offered for a free will donation of your choosing – or for free, based on need – and proceeds not used to cover costs will go to support local partners in our community. Also there are opportunities to safely volunteer to help with soup delivery, curbside pickup, or filling orders.

Called to Create and Participate: The Create-a-Crane Project

A colorful art installation will fly into the Sanctuary just in time for Easter and we need you to help grow the origami flock! Let your creative energy soar while transforming origami paper into cranes while relaxing at home. Then migrate your completed creations back to church to nest in SALC's own artistic aviary.

-enjoy seeing the completed art installation in the church Sanctuary on Easter Sunday, knowing that you were Called to Create and Participate!
