A paradox is a situation where opposite ideas or realities can be true at the exact same time. For instance, since announcing my resignation, I've been both excited and sad at the exact same time. It's hard to leave Saint Andrew and I'm sad that this important time is coming to an end. I'm so excited for this new endeavor to work for the regional church and the chance to live near Don (my significant other for over two years now). A paradox gets us thinking less in black and white and more in the "grey."

When a congregation is "open to all" – it asserts that it belongs to the "grey."

We are not all alike. We do not all agree. That doesn't mean that we can't come to the same table to receive the same grace and love – especially when we disagree. And yet, as much as I've loved to serve the mission of being "open to all," I've also struggled when some have been quick to call perspectives that truly belong to "openness" political. Calling something political is a buzzword. What is the purpose of politics at its core? It has to do with the relationship between people living in a society. Somewhere along the way, the separation of church and state gave the world the assumption that religion and politics can't sit at the same dinner table and talk as friends. But the truth is, religion also has to do with the relationship between people living in society – just look at the Ten Commandments. The Women of the ELCA

developed a really helpful study guide to ponder the intersection between <u>faith and</u> <u>politics</u>.

Issues of social justice are often cast as "political", but they are of vital importance to Jesus, to the ELCA, and to a church whose mission is to be "open to all." In a spirit of openness, I want to make sure that as I take my leave I am clear with you on a few of the ELCA's positions that some have recently shared with me seem "too political." For instance, the sharing of gendered pronouns in the Weekly Wave articles. There's a reason why Pastor Justin and Michelle do that regularly and it has to do with what you will find in the <u>Social Statement on Human Sexuality</u> from the ELCA. (See page 20 for the various faithful stances you will find on human sexuality in the ELCA). There is diversity in the body of Christ! As we honor that diversity, we care for the vulnerable.

I will challenge you to know what is really at the core belief system of the denomination where you are worshipping whether that's at Saint Andrew – or if the Holy Spirit has sent you to seek nurture elsewhere in Covidtide. What does the ELCA believe about social issues? You're in luck! There's a whole list of social statements you can access here. If in this interim time you have sought out refuge in other worshipping in-person congregations, you can find their belief systems here: Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS – Mount Olive, St. Mark's, Trinity), Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC - Zion Lutheran Church), Non-Denominational Churches (Highland Community Church), and here's a resource that can help you identify differences and similarities between the ELCA and any other Christian denomination.


For Saint Andrew, staying "open to all" means honoring that call through the lens of the ELCA. That might be why you hear Pastor Justin or myself sounding "political." The truth is we will never be partisan; but we will address issues of justice in society due to our call to talk about these matters as they pertain to God's greatest commandment, to "love our neighbor as we love ourselves" and to honor the promises made in baptism, "to work for justice and peace." How different the world would be if we could see God's love wrapped in the paradox of human experiences. Together, staying open means embracing the grey. And I figure – if God is open to me, then surely God must be "open to all"... and maybe in that case, we are invited to be, too.


Celebrate the Class of 2021!


