The long green season after Pentecost is a season of discipleship, where we grow deeper in our faith. We have heard the story of what God has done for us. From love born at Christmas, to Jesus' light shining through miracles, conversations, parables, and teachings, among us, we have witnessed the gift of God's own self crossing the space between heaven and earth to know us and our lives in a new way. As we reflected upon the necessity of the cross in Lent, we witnessed the depth of God's desire to be with us even in the darkest parts of life. In Easter's dawn, we celebrated our new lives in the salvation that God has brought us. Now, after the celebration of the generous gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, we are invited to a life of discipleship.

As we answer the Spirit's call, we become disciples, like Peter, James, John, Andrew, and the rest. While it feels strange to consider ourselves in company with them, it is good company to be in. As fellow disciples, we can learn from one another about the impact of the Gospel on our lives. We can celebrate with one another how our actions reflect God's generous gift of God's self, as we give of ourselves for the life of those around us. We can hold one another accountable for remaining centered on Christ while the world tries to draw our attention away from our role as stewards of what we have been given. We can accept the generosity of others to pick back up when we stumble and fall, and continue to journey with our abundant God, through acts of worship, learning, witness and service.

The generosity of God's people is families of disciples living generous lives, teaching generosity through conversation and example. As faith is nurtured and disciples grow, generations approach life understanding that God has called us to be servants of the Servant. It is small groups, mentors, and partners who find ways to reflect God's generosity by investing their time in one another, using their talents for service, and sharing their treasures in creative and inventive ways as the Holy Spirit inspires. It is communities of people understanding that whatever we have has been entrusted to our stewardship by God and is not ours alone. It is congregations worshiping a God of abundance and becoming the overflowing cup to bless their members and community with the time, talents, and treasures that God has given them to steward. Generosity is not a specific action, but the outlook of disciples who have been shaped by what God in Christ has done for us.

We will be reflecting on generosity this summer in some unique ways. There have already been invitations to be generous with time as we are retuning to indoor, inperson worship. Those who have offered their talents as Assisting Minister are being generous with their talents. Faith Formation will be reviving their work with the Generosity Project, too. June - Council's Communication Corner

Here are the 5 monthly bullet points about the work of your church.

1. We're Back

The Worship Ministry has been working very hard to restart a full worship schedule. THANK YOU WORSHIP MINISTRY! This schedule includes two services on Thursdays (12:15 & 6:15 pm) as well as three services on Sunday (8, 9:15 & 10:30 am). Four of the services are in the Sanctuary with the 10:30 am Sunday service on the Celebration Patio. The Livestream will remain during the 9:15 am service. We are continuing social distancing and masks for those not vaccinated when indoors. Best of all? Singing is back! We look forward to seeing you in person.

2. Call Committee & Lead Pastor Updates

Over 40 members volunteered or were nominated for the Call Committee for the next Lead Pastor. Thank you to all of those who are stepping up to help with this extremely important decision for the church. At the most recent council meeting the list was narrowed down to achieve a diversified committee of female and male, young and wise, young families and empty-nesters. Myself and Vice-President Dayna Herold will be making calls in the upcoming week to solidify this committee. Council member, Mark Clark has volunteered to chair this committee and will be a great asset in helping lead. Meetings will begin shortly after as the committee will be updating our MSP (Ministry Site Profile) and beginning the search process for the next lead pastor.

3. Interim Pastor Updates

Pastor Asher O'Callaghan - Associate to the Bishop and Director of Transitions and Discernment in the East Central Synod is helping us in this process of finding an Interim Pastor. There are three current options that are being pursued in hopes of having a solution sooner than later. A bit of disappointing news to share is Pastor Gary Brandenburg was very interested in coming back to Saint Andrew, but unfortunately due to a recent health concern he is unable to return. We ask that you please keep him and his family in your prayers.

4. Financial Updates

The church is operating very lean right now as we do not have a Lead Pastor, Interim, or Communications Coordinator. The Finance Ministry, headed by Mark Gleisner, has done an excellent job in budgeting and being very fiscally responsible over the course of the pandemic. We are so blessed to be in a position where our church is thriving financially. I want to note that there are some larger expenses in front of us with the positions that need to be filled, but I'm confident that the financial professionals will do their part as well as the members in continuing to provide such generous gifts to the church.

5. +1 Ministry

Since introducing +1 Ministry (giving that little bit extra) we have seen some amazing examples from Saint Andrew members and staff. Members are stepping up to read, usher, assist in pastoral duties, work on the stream team, join a committee, and volunteer time to a ministry group. The council wants to thank all for their efforts and encourage others to join in the movement of doing the work of the church. Reach out to a staff or council member if you would like to find out how you can get involved.

Specifically, we would like to extend a special thank you to the Plan to Gather Task Force who has been meeting frequently for over a year now. It was their research and recommendations that made Saint Andrew's Plan to Gather guidance a model for many ELCA churches in the area.
