Network Note from Pastor Justin

I don't know how the soil in your yard is, but there is an annoying thing that happens in mine. When I have to pour off some water after a rain, I must be very careful, otherwise the grass can be pulled out of the ground by the force of even a little water. Its roots aren't very deep and wherever there is constant motion of water, like under the gutters, or feet, like under my daughter's hammock swings, the ground is bare.

We have a Gospel reading about deep roots and good soil. (Matthew 13, Mark 4, and Luke 8) OK, we have three Gospel readings about the Parable of the Sower, which illustrates the power of deep roots in good soil to improve the health and life of the plants. Deeper roots prevent plants from being choked out by weeds. Deeper roots prevent the heat of the sun from wilting the plants. The deeper the roots, the harder it is to remove the plant.

We are turning from summer to fall, the start of school, the start of college, the start of Sunday school, the start of confirmation, and the start of many things that help us grow deeper roots in many different areas. We also have the opportunity to grow deeper roots in our faith and as families. One of the best ways to grow together is spending time in worship. In the midst of hectic schedules, time together is proven to strengthen families. It is likely that, as you are reading this newsletter, faith and connection to a faith community is valuable to you. Either coming to church, watching the livestream together, or even a simple bedtime devotional and prayer are ways to help pass those values on to children and grandchildren.

When we take time to attend to sinking our roots of faith deeper into life with God, we will find ourselves growing in new ways. The connection to God through prayer can help us find peace in the midst of a continuing pandemic. The connection to God through worship can help us find inspiration and comfort in what God in Christ has done for us. The connection to God through community can provide us companions for the journey. The connection to God through family can remind us of the generations that have helped us grow our roots of faith and show us how we can help generations to come.

You are invited to join us and find ways to grow your own roots of faith deeper by connecting with what is going on at Saint Andrew. Even as the pandemic continues, we are continuing to grow our roots deeper through worship, learning, witness, and service. You are invited to join with us in this growth and in the deepening of our roots in God's Word, God's Promises, and God's Work through those rooted in God.

August - Council's Communication Corner

Hello Saint Andrew! My name is Derek Hoff, your Church Council President. Here are the 5 monthly bullet points about the work of your church. This is the Council's Communication Corner for August.

- 1. Plan to Gather Our Plan to Gather Task Force and Church Council have deemed it necessary to adjust our criteria for moving back to Phase 1 where gatherings were heavily restricted. We will move back to Phase 1 after two weeks at a burden level of 1,000 or higher. The website has been updated to reflect these changes. Ultimately, it was discussed that due to vaccinations, safety protocols implemented, and different worship options that we made the change. This creates more stability for us to plan how to gather for worship, learning, witness and service this fall. Thanks again to our Call Committee members for their continued great work: Mark Clark, Randy Trollop, Christina Johnson, Lyn Weis, Kim Hoff, Curt Richardt, Faith Fehrman, and Nick Josiger!
- **4. +1 Ministry** We continue to see members stepping up and doing a little extra for our church. A special thank you to Phil Bickley who volunteered his time once again to transport our youth to Waypost for Day Camp. One of many selfless acts from Uncle Phil. Thank you!
