Luther Individual from Pastor Justin

Martin Luther has a famous quote, which I have on a pair of souvenir socks, "Heir Stehe Ich, Ich Kann Nicht Anders." (Here, I stand. I can do no other) In these defiant words, in front of representatives of the Roman Catholic Church and the Holy Roman Emperor, Luther claims his standing on the Bible, the word of God, alone. This appears in art and culture as the image of Luther standing by himself in the midst of a hostile room, as if one man defied the world.

But Luther was not alone.

Fredrick the Wise, Elector of Saxony, encouraged Luther's disputation of indulgences and protected him from the Emperor and Rome. Luther's preaching and teaching brought great acclaim to the young University of Wittenberg and gave the Elector a reason to keep indulgence sellers away from his people.

Lucas Cranach, the printer and painter, used the movable type press to print Luther's words across Europe. This placed the Gospel in the hands of the increasingly educated middle classes of Europe spreading thoughts and ideas that challenged the established hierarchy of medieval Europe. Cranach's woodcut images carried images of Luther and illustrations of the Gospel to those who could not read.

Luther's academic colleagues helped him understand the Greek, Hebrew, and Aramaic texts of the Bible, making his German translation the clearest, to date. Had Luther not also worked alongside German-speaking butchers, cooks, builders, and tradesmen, learning the way they spoke and the words they used, Luther's translation of the bible would not have been a unifying work for the German language. All of this made it accessible to the average German who made Jesus and the disciples sound like their fellow townsfolk.

Alone, Luther would not have had the impact he did, but he was never alone.

The greatest learning of Reformation theology is that God is with us, not as an angry judge, but a loving savior. Luther grew up in a world that demanded that you do things for God, and never spoke of what God in Christ has done for you. This Gospel is what brings so much joy in service and is what draws people together because it reminds us that we are not alone. When Luther realized that God was with him and for him, he found the peace that he had been searching for. He was not simply an individual trying to earn his way into heaven, but was part of the larger story of salvation.

This is Luther's legacy. He was part of a larger story of reclaiming the faith of the past to shape the future. This is the reformation that will shape the next 500 years of faith. We are not individuals who shape our own salvation. We are Baptized Children of God who have a place this in the story of salvation, alongside all the faithful. Because we can read the story, know the story, and live the story of scripture, we can set aside the proof-texting, doctrinal bickering, and denominational one-upmanship to recognize God's invitation, building the Kingdom of God. Because, freed by the Gospel, we can do no other.

SANCTUARY RENEWAL PROJECT

Bushel of Prayers
