# Wake Up and Smell the Coffee

I am writing this mid-March to be read in April, when we're on the verge of Holy Week and Easter. But for now, I sit in the aftermath of daylight saving time. Have you blocked out the blurry-eyed days after the time change when an hour of our lives was sucked away? I can't seem to forget it. There is, however, a fitting metaphor for the season of life that we are in, right now, in 2022. Instead of one hour lost, we have spent two years operating in a vastly different mode than the rest of our lives. We are in a place that feels like the Monday after daylight saving time. Instead of simply needing an extra cup (pot?) of coffee to function, we need you.

Churches run on volunteer participation like pastors run on coffee. As a pastor myself, I know. Like the Bunn coffee makers that are connected to our water system to fill the pots with coffee, I recall stepping into the buzz of life at Saint Andrew in 2020. However, when Covid hit, we slowed to a pour-over single cup at a time process where each task was approached with care and precision to keep our community healthy.

I want to personally thank everyone who helped us find new ways to function in the midst of this change in coffee production through volunteer engagement: The livestream worship, the outdoor services, Soup for Community, Zoom Bible studies, the Sanctuary Renewal, the Rainbeau Corner, t.R.I.B.e., Sunday School, and other ways that we don't have the space to list here. None of it would have been possible were it not for you, the members of Saint Andrew, being generous with your time, talents, and treasures over the last two years.

I also want to personally invite you to join us as we worship, learn, witness, and serve this year. As we look to step up into the buzz of life again, we need coffee. If you want to step back into those pre-Covid ways that you served, we would love to have you. If you want to explore something new, that is great! Let us help you get connected.

You are the pot of coffee that will overflow our cup and help us wake up to the things—both new and old—that the Holy Spirit is working in and around Saint Andrew—in this metaphorical week after daylight saving time, when Saint Andrew wakes from Covid slumber and smells the fresh brewed coffee.

# HOLY WEEK GOO-PR. LESLIE

I was not much younger than I am now when I learned that the metamorphosis of a caterpillar from worm to butterfly involves the little bug turning to a complete pile of goo inside that tidy little chrysalis. As a child, I remember imagining that process more like the slow emergence of legs on a tadpole, that the caterpillar was gently trading in its fuzzy legs for wings and a long tongue. But science is seldom the gentle imagination of a nine-year-old. And so, we need the goo for that transformation to take place and butterfly to be ready for its next journey.

This month of April is a bit of a chrysalis. We walk the final weeks of lent and then crawl into the cocoon of holy week only to be reduced to blubbering goo as we remember the very death of God in the person of Jesus and those moments when the world stood still, awaiting the resurrection that it hoped for but had yet



to see. And every year, we emerge on the wings of grace with our Alleluias echoing on the breeze and the buds of Easter hope blooming on our coffee tables.

This year has been a whirl of transition for many of us, and as I write these words on my second day as one of your pastors, I am aware that the process of change and newness is not all crocuses and sunshine. It's hard. It hurts. It makes us question our place over, and over, and over. Holy Week for me this year is already a call to tuck in and let myself be completely remade by the love of Jesus. The tears he shed, the cries he cried, the sadness, the love, the death and stillness...and the resurrection; these are for us, dear ones! Take the time to sit with them. Let them unmake you and pull you back together. And then step into Easter morning however you need to be. This year, we read the resurrection account in Luke's gospel, and there is a plethora of emotion that accompanies those who visit the empty tomb. They step into the reality with amazement, fear, disbelief, and sadness. Sometimes it takes a bit of time to reach the joy. Butterflies come out of the chrysalis all wrinkly and wet; it takes some time before the breezes are their ride in the sunshine. As we emerge from yet another bit of Covid and the changes it has brought to our worship and gathering, I encourage you to have hearts open to the new and the ways we are church in an ever-changing world, called to proclaim the life-transforming love of Jesus everywhere we find ourselves.

So together, let us embrace the chrysalis of April and the change God is working in each of our hearts as beloved children of the One who loved us and continues to love us so very much, even when we are a little bit gooey.
