A Message from Jenna Diedrich - Faith Formation Coordinator

This August marks my third year working at Saint Andrew, and I think it is safe to say that each year has been drastically different than the last. My role as Faith Formation Coordinator has evolved and shifted with every transition, every new beginning and every challenge that has been presented to us in the last couple of years. Throughout that time, I have been learning about different ways to best equip our members to live out our church's mission and I am looking forward to using all that I have learned to help plan and create a pathway to lifelong faith formation for the members of Saint Andrew.



Faith formation isn't just about Sunday school, it isn't just about confirmation classes, and it doesn't just happen at church on Sunday mornings. Lifelong faith formation is about introducing building blocks of faith, nurturing a deeper connection with Jesus and our community, and equipping and guiding our members to live out their faith in every aspect of their lives—no matter their age.

John Roberto writes in his book, *Lifelong Faith*, "Through lifelong faith formation, churches are becoming centers of lifelong learning and growth for all people, bringing an abundance of meaningful and engaging experiences to the whole community, to families, and to people at each stage of the life span from childhood through older adulthood."

A shift in focus often comes with a change of practice and you will notice some significant changes coming to Saint Andrew this fall. But all these changes are coming from a desire to become a center of growth for our members. We are adjusting our worship schedule, adding a one-hour block of education for all ages on Sunday morning and changing the structure of our Thursday night service time.

AN EXPANDING SCHEDULE FOR OUR LIFE TOGETHER!

Dear ones of Saint Andrew,

To say that change has been in the forefront of our lives over the past three years might be the understatement of the millennium. As a congregation you have adjusted and readjusted to new realities and transitional normal, hoping with every shift that it might settle in for the long haul. You have persevered and grown in the process, and where the rubs have left blisters, I hope you've also found healing in the presence of the One who promises to be with us on the road. This has not been an easy journey, and I write these words with tender love, holding heart space with you for the losses that have not found words and the frustrations and hopes that seem on permanent hold.

As we navigate the next stage of life together, we would like to introduce a new schedule of worship and learning that will hopefully frame our ministry here in Rib Mountain and the wider world for quite some time. Many factors have been taken into consideration, including the current state of Covid19, capacity of current staff and leadership, the faith formation needs of all demographics of the congregation, and our unfolding vision to reach more boldly into the community with the love of Jesus.

Sunday Worship Services: Beginning on **September 18**, worship will be held on **Sundays at 8:00 and 10:30 am**, with one or both of these services livestreamed as we live into the reality and needs of our online community.

Midweek Worship on Wednesdays at 12:15 pm: A midweek worship service, similar in content to the Sunday preceding will be held in the Chapel. This is a shift from our Thursday schedule but will remain around 30 minutes for those who like to come and worship over the lunch hour. During special seasons of the year, such as Lent, the midweek service will reflect the season, and an evening service will be added at 6:15 pm.

Faith Formation Opportunities. Sunday mornings will offer learning opportunities for all ages, with a Sunday School hour from 9:15-10:15 am. Children 3 years old through 6th grade are invited to Sunday School. Older youth and adult classes will be offered throughout the building with a schedule coming soon for your planning and anticipation. You can expect a mix of Bible study and topical forums to challenge and engage us as children of God called to live out our baptism in the world. Confirmation for students grades 6-8 will be held Wednesdays, 6:00-8:30 pm.

Thursday Evening Worship: will shift from a worship service to an adult bible study that will change periodically to explore topics of interest, biblical books and theological topics, book studies, and occasional events for families. Our hope is that these 4-8 week capsules of time will encourage all of us to prioritize faith learning without feeling pressured to commit to months at a time. **These studies will be held at 7:00 pm.**

These new times and schedules will begin September 18. If you have concerns or questions, I am happy to talk with you and provide whatever insight I can.

FAITH FORMATION NEWS AND DATES

SAFE GATHERINGS VOLUNTEER SCREENING

Saint Andrew is committed to the safety of our youngest members and will be asking all those who wish to volunteer with our children and youth programs to complete additional requirements as part of an updated Safe Place Policy and resolution through the East Central Synod of Wisconsin stating, "all ECSW congregations and ministries to have in place a policy outlining rules and requirements for those working with children, youth, and other vulnerable populations by December, 2023....[that] shall provide for the training, background checks, and subsequent trainings for any and all persons working with the above mentioned groups". Saint Andrew will be using Safe Gatherings, an online tool that helps streamline and automate a screening process for volunteers. It includes electronic reference checks, 4 levels of background checks and an online Abuse Prevention and Boundary Awareness Training. Once completed, this certification will be good for 2 years.

Please Note: Volunteers cannot be placed in a position to work with children or youth until their application and training through Safe Gatherings is completed and approved. If you are interested in volunteering with children and/or youth at Saint Andrew, please contact jenna@salc-wausau.org to get the process started.

WHAT IS OLD AND WHAT IS NEW - *by Pr. Justin*

The shore of Galilee was cool. The harp-shaped lake that was the prominent feature of the region provided rest for weary travelers along the Via Maris as they walked along the trade caravans on the way to Damascus, with Egyptian goods. The Roman legions appreciated the relaxed posting out here, as opposed to being down in the Judean desert. The crowds of fishermen, farmers, women, vintners, olive tenders, and the occasional merchant gathered close to the seaside because there was a man speaking.

“Have you all understood this?” he asked the crowds with a tone of finality. While murmurs of assent ran through the crowd as they turned over the stories about seeds falling on different types of soil, about weeds, wheat, mustard seeds, and all manner of mundane things. Before they could begin to converse about what they had heard and go back to their homes, his voice rang out again. The wind dropped at the moment and through the stillness rang, “everyone trained for the kingdom of heaven is like the master of a household who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old.”

These words hung in the air.

The people were still, and Jesus’ sandals ground into the dust of the earth as he walked away from the lakeshore.

These words of Jesus still hang in the air despite the thousands of years and miles that separates us from that time and place. The Kingdom of Heaven has come near and we begin to see this. In every word, in the parables, teachings, miracles, and wonder, this reality resolves itself before our very eyes. The deep being of God, the ancient, eternal presence of our Creator is present in Jesus.

Treasures old and new, as descriptors seem like a failure of our finite language to grasp the movement of God. Jesus is God’s movement towards us, outpacing sin’s pull away it is as if we haven’t moved, but something changed. This is blessed newness, but not anything that hasn’t been before. God is still God. Gracious. Merciful. Slow to Anger. Filled with Loyal Love. Old words that echo in Jesus’ life.

So, are they truly new, or are they renewing?

Is there a difference?

We are engaging in a similar transition here. The pre-covid patterns of worship and gathering are shifting, carrying what was so lifegiving to people in a way that opens space for others to join in, to bring opportunities for growth and engagement, to give us space to breath deeply the breath of God. An intermingling that draws us closer to one another and closer to God.
