And God said to Abram... I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing... and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed. ~Genesis 12:1-3

Let's talk about stewardship! We tend to reserve this weighty word for the fall when we start looking at next year's spending plan, dreaming of what we might do in ministry together and discerning the best ways to fund programs and operations of the church. This is good and necessary work! But I would love it if we thought about stewardship in April and August as well. Because the truth is, you are always doing this work of stewardship! Stewardship is looking at the resources we have been given and using them in a way that glorifies our God, whose riches they are in the first place. We sit at the table to eat a meal and we thank God for the blessing of food that nourishes us for the day's work. That is stewardship. We take time away from home with our families for a vacation or holiday with others, and we thank God for the presence of family and friends in our lives, or the beauty of creation that surrounds us in travel. That is also stewardship. When the church office calls and says someone is in need of a meal or a visit, we thank God for the opportunity to share in time and casseroles. This, too, is stewardship.

Rooted in gratitude and joy, we bring to God what God has given, trusting one another to use those gifts in ways that further the mission of Christ's church: to create space to gather, to reach out to the community in Christ's love, and to give generously for the work of the church in the world. I ask you to prayerfully consider how you might give of your resources for our ministry together. And then come and give thanks with us as we celebrate the joy of being a blessing.

Our worship over the month of October will give us a chance to explore the ways we are woven together in community and blessing, and then on November 6, between services, come and enjoy brunch as we celebrate in gratitude together that we can bless our community, from popsicles in the parking lot to picnics that gather us to community dinners downtown that feed our neighbors with food and love.

Our faith calls us to give generously, and I thank God every day for you, that you live your stewardship in so many ways that bless this community.

FALL CLEAN-UP




Saturday, October 22 starting at 8:00 am

AUDIOLOGY SURVEY

Karley Wehrman, a UW-Stevens Point audiology graduate student is currently working on a research project to determine if access to training materials on hearing loops affects the perceived use and satisfaction of hearing loops in adult hearing aid(s) and/or cochlear implant(s) users and may assist audiologists in the future. To participate you need to be 18 years or older and use (a) hearing aid(s) or (a) cochlear implant(s). This survey is completely anonymous, will not contain any personal information, and should only be completed once per person. GATEWAY TO PALESTINE PRESENTATION

Last May, I was blessed, by the people of Saint Andrew, to take a trip to the Holy Land. It was a trip that amazed me with the beauty, the history, and the importance of the land where Jesus walked. Over the first weeks of October, on Sunday mornings, I will share the story of this land, as I experienced it.

October 2: The Politics There is a long history of the peoples of the land, their claims, their struggles, and their conflicts. We will take a long view of the political history of the region and how those ancient accounts impact the current state of the land and the conflict between the modern State of Israel, its Arab neighbors, and the Palestinian people.

October 9: The Archeology The city of Jericho was founded 10,000 years before the time of Christ. There is a long and ingenious history of human settlement and construction. The most well-known builder in Palestinian history is Herod the Great, the king who tried to kill Jesus after his birth. We will look at the architecture and archeology of these ancient civilizations.

<u>October 16: The Faith</u> This is the land where the Temple stood, where Jesus lived, died, and rose again, and where the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) journeyed to heaven. These three faiths have a presence that is unmistakable, and we will see some of the holy places, the churches, the places of prayer, and the faith that shapes society in the Holy Land.

Why do we have so many staff?

The makeup of our staff changes as Council determines changes in our priorities, goals and needs, and the skills, experience and talents that our people have as well as the level of volunteers contributing to the work of the church.

When will our mortgage be paid off?
