One of my favorite stories of scripture is that of the disciples meeting the resurrected Jesus on the road to Emmaus. You can read it in Luke 24! On the road, two disciples are heading home from Jerusalem when they encounter Jesus but do not recognize him. He walks with them and along the way begins to open their understanding of how the scriptures had been pointing to the Messiah all the way back to Moses, soothing their broken hearts from the events of the crucifixion. Then he sits with them at the table, breaks the bread, and they know who he is in that instant! And then, though they could have just stayed home, those disciples RAN back to Jerusalem to let the others know what they had experienced. A walk, some talk, a meal, and then sharing our good news. That's how I want to know Jesus!

This fall, our walk together is going to take us down those ancient roads with our ancestors in the faith: Abraham, Moses, Jacob, Ruth...we will meet some new faces and hear the stories we might remember from childhood Sunday School. The Narrative Lectionary will be our map for Sundays and will offer us a chance to experience God's story with God's people as one large arch. We'll start with Noah and end with the birth of Jesus in December. Spring will take us on a journey with Christ and the disciples as we sit with some longer readings and wonder together about what they mean for us today. These are the stories that form us in our understanding of who God is and we will work through the tough parts in community. Like the disciples on the road, we get to know Jesus as we hear the stories of salvation history and then share the meal together where Christ nourishes us for the work of living God's love in this world!

I am excited for fall as we celebrate our life together as this body of Christ at Saint Andrew. I invite you into the autumn months with a renewed sense of wonder at this work we share. I encourage you to try something new this year as you are able; perhaps our new yoga or bible study on Thursday night will fit your schedule. Maybe you would like to hang out with our awesome confirmation students as a mentor. Come and get to know new friends in faith. Invite the folks you think might love our community. It's good to gather, so let's do it often and rejoice that Jesus meets us there every time! I'll see you at the picnic on September 11!!

T-COIL HEARING LOOP

The Sanctuary is equipped with a hearing loop system. Those with hearing devices with a t-coil are facility encouraged to turn them on or ask to have them programmed by an audiologist to take advantage of this improved system.

AUDIOLOGY SURVEY

My name is Karley Wehrman and I am a UW-Stevens Point audiology graduate student. I am currently working on a research project to determine if access to training materials on hearing loops affects the perceived use and satisfaction of hearing loops in adult hearing aid(s) and/or cochlear implant(s) users and may assist audiologists in the future.

Loop

To participate you have to be 18 years or older and use (a) hearing aid(s) or (a) cochlear implant(s). This survey is completely anonymous and will not contain any personal information such as your name, actual age, etc. This survey should only be completed once per person and can be completed either on paper or online.

A\$k Finance—Answers to Questions

Can my offerings be designated to the music ministry?

Offerings given to the general fund are the most helpful because they are used towards all our expenses according to our spending plan which includes our Worship/Music ministry. People can give designated gifts to specific funds where the money is used only for that fund's purpose. Saint Andrew has music related designated funds and a Memorial Gift fund. If you want to make a very specific gift, you should talk with one of the pastors to make sure it gets accounted for properly.

How much did we save in operational costs during COVID?

It's hard to determine how much we saved because we also had to spend additional amounts to pay for things like the communion celebration cups, masks, cleaning supplies and live streaming equipment. Our spending plan for 2020 was \$815,000 but we only spent \$692,385. Plus, we received a loan from the Payroll Protection Program for \$71,000 to help keep our staff employed during the pandemic. Because we did keep our staff employed during the pandemic, the loan was forgiven in 2021, so we did not have to repay it. In 2021 our spending plan was \$700,000 but we only spent \$612,302.


