#### Please tell us a little about yourself!

My husband, Mark, and I have been members of Saint Andrew for almost 30 years with Pastor John officiating our wedding 27 years ago. We have one son, Matthew (20) who attends a small college in Minneapolis. We are officially empty nesters.

In your opinion, what are the areas of opportunity for Saint Andrew that we could improve on? Being "open to all" is a very important part of our mission statement; I am so proud to tell people that. Shortening our mission statement would be a first step to help focus our efforts.

With mental health at an all-time low, I would love to see more in the way of groups that gather here or on Zoom meetings; a grief support group for those who have lost a loved one. The Stephen Project initiated where lay people are educated to care and listen to others on a confidential one-on-one basis, more bible study offerings in the evenings for those who cannot attend during the day.

I would also like to see us reaching out more to those folks who are unable to leave their homes and can't get to church, get their own groceries and/or have no family nearby. Matching people who are wanting to help others and those who need the help is key. How do we do that?

I've served on many ministries over the years, but the most challenging-worthwhile-satisfying endeavor was being a Sunday school teacher for 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grades and then a mentor for the confirmation students for two years. By far, following and teaching this same group of students over the course of five years was the highlight for me. Getting to know these children and watch them grow in their faith; priceless. I feel really good about going out of my comfort zone and being a part of their faith life. Having an assistant/helper in the class; also priceless!
