As the month of August continues to fly, even those of us without children in our homes cannot go very far without noticing that back-to-school planning and shopping is in full swing. With it comes the farewell to summer's comings and goings and we look forward to seeing more of everyone in the weeks to come. With the season of fall comes the new program schedule, which we hope you will put in your calendars and plans. As a community, it is our hope that there are events and opportunities for everyone here at Saint Andrew, and our planning takes into account the varied and diverse people we are when it comes to activities and needs for spiritual nurture and fellowship.

After much reflection and discussion with various ministry leaders, it has been officially decided to move forward with a single 9:00 am service time for this fall starting Sunday, September 24. Sunday School for children will meet at 10:15 am for a large group gathering in the Sanctuary and break into small groups from 10:30-11:00 am. Adult Bible Studies and programs will have more flexibility to begin either at 10:15, 10:30, or even at 8:00 am. Watch for more information on adult studies coming soon!

- One service will help ensure the various volunteer needs of worship are covered fully without more commitment or over-taxing the current volunteers.

- Faith formation events will fall more easily to either side of the worship service, allowing for expanded offerings.

Midweek worship services will continue again this fall, starting back up on *Wednesday, September 13 at 12:15 pm*. We will continue to livestream our Sunday services online, and broadcast them to local access television.

We will continue to hold these worship times in conversation as the year progresses. Right now, what a blessing to be together in worship, to hear the singing of our voices in praise of our Lord Jesus, and to love one another in prayer and in service.

Safe Gatherings Volunteer Screening

Saint Andrew is committed to the safety of our youngest members and will be asking all those who wish to volunteer with our children and youth programs to complete requirements as part of an updated Safe Place Policy and resolution through the East Central Synod of Wisconsin stating, "all ECSW congregations and ministries to have in place a policy outlining rules and requirements for those



working with children, youth, and other vulnerable populations by December, 2023.... [that] shall provide for the training, background checks, and subsequent trainings for any and all persons working with the above mentioned groups". Saint Andrew will be using Safe Gatherings, an online tool that helps streamline and automate a screening process for volunteers. It includes electronic reference checks, 4 levels of background checks and an online Abuse Prevention and Boundary Awareness Training. Once completed, this certification will be good for 2 years.

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH SCHOOL KIT FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 1/2"; no loose leaf paper ONE 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other ONE pencil sharpener ONE pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well) FIVE unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons ONE 2 1/2" eraser ONE sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag, approximately 14" x 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks) INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging* ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging * Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

Stream Team Volunteers

Stream Team is the backbone of Saint Andrew's live and in-person worship services and is looking for additional volunteers for either of two roles:

- Video Switcher: follows a service order and selects what is viewed on the livestream.
 Switches between different cameras and the ProPresenter slide feed assisting the viewers to see worship and follow along.
- STREAM TEAM
 Helps make worship happen

• **ProPresenter Operator:** follows a service order and cues to advance slides at the proper time to assist the congregation in-person and online follow the service and participate in worship.
