As time progressed I joined the Social Ministry Committee, then joined the Youth Committee, then became a Sunday school teacher and confirmation mentor, then became a council member and on and on until, finally I entered the seminary. All because of the Ministry of Persistent Invitation.

Today I extend an invitation to you – each one who reads this note. Come Home! We are preparing for Christmas. It is the season of coming home. Not just to be with your nuclear family but – this year, especially – to be with your church family. Come Home!

I also encourage you to enter into a shared Ministry of Persistent Invitation. I bet you know some folks who have taken a brief sabbatical from worship at Saint Andrew. Ask them to Come Home. It is a time of transition. It is a new beginning. Ask them to experience Saint Andrew once again. Ask them to Come Home!

As I have been visiting with Saint Andrew leaders, I am impressed by the number of people who came here because of someone's Persistent Invitation. Remember "no" only means "not right now."



2024 Budget Review Meeting

Prior to congregational approval at the Annual Meeting on January 28, 2024, the proposed 2024 Spending Plan will be presented for review and questions. The Finance Ministry invites everyone to attend this informative meeting.

Throughout our history at Saint Andrew we've been able to do things that are important to our mission, community, and the world because we haven't been afraid to step forward and ask our members for financial support.

As we move into the final months of 2023 and prepare financially for 2024, **thank you**, **thank you**, **thank you** to all who have already completed your pledge for giving in support of the ongoing ministry here at Saint Andrew. Plans for giving are extremely important for Saint Andrew's budgeting process (Spending Plan), and we are asking this year more than ever to consider completing a pledge.

As of November 28, 2023 we have received almost enough pledges to support a proposed 2024 spending plan of \$548,000 which is approximately \$77,000 below our 2023 spending plan of \$625,000.

This means that for those who have yet to turned in their plans for giving, we ask that you thoughtfully and prayerfully consider your plan following your heart, and trusting in God's promise to provide for all that you need and more.

While we are currently a congregation in transition, we are still a healthy, vibrant community. We have many expressions of ministry that have a profound impact. Increased giving means that we are not only able to support all that exists but to develop our ministry in broader ways.


American Red Cross Blood Drive

Communion for the Homebound


