Report to the Bishop





Mortgage Reduction Appeal

Saint Andrew has an incredible opportunity to make a lasting impact on the future of our church and mission. We are blessed that two Saint Andrew families have offered to contribute up to a combined \$75,000 toward paying down our mortgage if the congregation will match those offers.


Saint Andrew has a mortgage of \$388,865 as of December 31. The loan must be renegotiated this summer and it is likely that our interest rate will increase. It feels



like a very good time to substantially reduce the amount we will need to refinance. By paying down our mortgage balance now our mortgage will be paid off sooner allowing for more funds for ministry and mission.
