## A New Weekly Service Beginning March 3

#### Sundays, 5:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall

Saint Andrew is launching a new weekly worship service on Sunday evenings called The Welcome Table. Two of the biggest insights gathered from the survey taken in the fall is that this community connects with the mission of being "open to all," and that 72 of 220 families that replied would like to have an evening worship option. From those insights, we have discerned and created a worship service that we believe will connect with those who are:

- Looking to explore their faith and ask questions
- In middle/high school, and who are looking to apply their faith to daily life
- Current congregants who are looking for an evening service option

The service has 3 core components - come for one or come for all:

#### \*5:00-5:45 pm: Interest groups/dinner

Small groups forming based on common life stages or interests.

#### \*5:30-6:00 pm: Dinner/Fellowship

March 3 is pizza night and gluten/egg free pizzas will be available.

#### \*6-6:30 pm: Worship

Modern and reflective music, discussion of scripture and how it could be applied to our lives, and communion around the dinner table.

We hope this service provides an opportunity to make or strengthen connections to God, to one another, and to a community of people that, as Pastor Gary shared one Sunday, "Need a lot of love, and have a lot of love to give!"



## **Mortgage Reduction Appeal**

Saint Andrew has an incredible opportunity to make a lasting impact on the future of our church and mission. We are blessed that two Saint Andrew families have offered to contribute up to a combined \$75,000 toward paying down our mortgage if the congregation will match those offers.

Saint Andrew has a mortgage of \$388,865 as of December 31. The loan must be renegotiated this summer and it is likely that our interest rate will increase. It feels like a very good time to substantially reduce the amount we will need to refinance. By paying down our mortgage balance now our mortgage will be paid off sooner allowing for more funds for ministry and mission.
