# COMMUNITY CONVERSATIONS

You are invited to participate in our Community Conversation Series. This will provide members the opportunity to provide input on the Strategic Planning Work by the Church Council and the information we are gathering to include in our Mission Site Profile (Church Resume) as part of the Call Process for our next Pastor here at Saint Andrew.

- There will be 6 tables set up and members will be asked to provide input on the questions below.
- Participants will rotate tables every 10 minutes, so you can provide ideas and input on each question.

• A 7th table will be set up for our confirmation and high school students to have their own questions to provide input on as well.

The questions to ponder between now and Sunday are:

- 1. What primary areas of activity or focus do you wish our newly-called rostered leader give special attention to during the first year of his/her ministry at Saint Andrew?
- 2. What ways will our congregation support and encourage the rostered leader during the first year in order to help her/him to accomplish the identified areas of focus?
- 3. Do you believe your best years are before us or behind us? Why do you believe this?
- 4. What are three, present, major missional objectives and three we wish to accomplish in the next five years to reach out in our community.
- 5. What are the major significant relational groups currently present in your church and what relational groups would you like to see developed in the next five years?
- 6. What size of congregation do you believe we should strive to be now and in the next five years? Why do you feel this way? (Size theory presentation by Pastor Gary)

## The Welcome Table: A New Weekly Service Beginning March 3 Sundays, 5:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall

Saint Andrew is launching a new weekly worship service on Sunday evenings called The Welcome Table. Two of the biggest insights gathered from the survey taken in the fall is that this community connects with the mission of being "open to all," and that 72 of 220 families that replied would like to have an evening worship option. From those insights, we have discerned and created a worship service that we believe will connect with those who are:

- Looking to explore their faith and ask questions
- In middle/high school, and who are looking to apply their faith to daily life
- Current congregants who are looking for an evening service option

The service has 3 core components - come for one or come for all:

#### \*5:00-5:45 pm: Interest groups/dinner

Small groups forming based on common life stages or interests.

#### \*5:30-6:00 pm: Dinner/Fellowship

March 3 is pizza night and gluten/egg free pizzas will be available.

#### \*6-6:30 pm: Worship

Modern and reflective music, discussion of scripture and how it could be applied to our lives, and communion around the dinner table.

We hope this service provides an opportunity to make or strengthen connections to God, to one another, and to a community of people that, as Pastor Gary shared one Sunday, "Need a lot of love, and have a lot of love to give!"



# **Mortgage Reduction Appeal**

Saint Andrew has an incredible opportunity to make a lasting impact on the future of our church and mission. We are blessed that two Saint Andrew families have offered to contribute up to a combined \$75,000 toward paying down our mortgage if the congregation will match those offers.

Saint Andrew has a mortgage of \$388,865 as of December 31. The loan must be renegotiated this summer and it is likely that our interest rate will increase. It feels like a very good time to substantially reduce the amount we will need to refinance. By paying down our mortgage balance now our mortgage will be paid off sooner allowing for more funds for ministry and mission.

# Recorded Worship on Spectrum


Sunday worship is livestreamed on the SALC Facebook page each week. The recorded service can then be found on channel 980 through Charter/Spectrum on the following days and times:
