Pastoral Search Update for Saint Andrew Lutheran Church

As your Call Committee, we feel that it is important to update you on the Pastoral Search for our church.

To lead the search for our next pastor for Saint Andrew, the Call Committee was formed in June of 2024. Our first meeting with the synod was on July 18 and at that time stepped through the process that is followed in the call process.

By mid-August, we had reviewed our church's MSP (Ministry Site Profile) and formulated the questions we felt would be appropriate for a first interview of a pastor candidate which is done by Zoom. We also held a mock interview by Zoom with a current ELCA Pastor to have our questions rehearsed, critiqued and improved upon.

From that time in mid-August, we have been presented with four potential candidates. We chose not to proceed with two of those candidates; had a first interview with one and chose not to pursue further; and are currently awaiting a response from the fourth candidate to establish a first interview.

We feel that our recommendation and the congregation's approval of our next pastor is a very important decision and also that Saint Andrew is a very attractive call for the right pastor and therefore must be chosen very prudently.

The steps that we have taken and are in process of continuing include seeking potential candidates through our several retired pastors in our church and candidate recommendations from other retired pastors in our area. We will now begin using social media and our own print media to assist in our search. The tools we are also implementing include reaching out through LinkedIn and we have placed an ad in Christian Century, both online and in print for the April issue.

You will soon see an invitation to potential pastoral candidates in the Network, in our bulletins and on Facebook. In addition to your ongoing prayers, we would ask that you consider helping us to get the word out by personal conversations and by "sharing" on Facebook.

We, as the Call Committee, are very excited by the future of Saint Andrew and are confident in our church to be able to call a very qualified pastor who will help us continue the mission of Saint Andrew Lutheran Church.

Ash Wednesday, March 5; 12:15 and 6:15 pm


Join us each Wednesday in Lent as we hear from people who


