

"A Place for Us" - by Fatima Farheen Mirza

As an Indian wedding gathers a family back together, parents Rafiq and Layla must reckon with the choices their children have made.

There is Hadia, their headstrong eldest daughter, whose marriage is a match of love and not tradition; Huda, the

middle child, determined to follow in her sister's footsteps; and lastly, their estranged son, Amar, who returns to the family fold for the first time in three years to take his place as brother of the bride.

"A Place for Us" is a book for our times: an astonishingly tenderhearted novel of identity and belonging, and a resonant portrait of what it means to be an American family today.



"Short Stories by Jesus" - by Amy Jill Levine: Have we domesticated Jesus's radical and provocative parables? As subversive as any parable, this book not only offers readers new ears for hearing stories we thought we knew by heart; it also shakes the faithful where we most need to be shaken.

In our 2025 Campaign for the Community, we will be promoting Saint Andrew as a congregation who provides compassionate care for those who feel troubled in spirit or soul.

It is one thing to hear a sermon, sing a hymn or share in conversation when feeling spiritual dis-ease. It is another to have one share in a prayer that lifts one's specific concerns to the very throne of God.

During the next several weeks, I would like to develop a cadre of Compassionate Prayer Givers who can be stationed in the chapel after each service and be available for prayer to those who are feeling that need.

I don't envision any person to be present in the chapel for more than 15 minutes after each Sunday service. It would be nice to have 2-3 people present each Sunday. I hope that we can recruit enough pray-ers so that no one needs to serve more than once each month.

Let me know if this might be a ministry that interests you. We will provide training. I would like to get started by mid-summer.
