Special Congregational Meeting to Call a Lead Pastor

The Congregation Council has called a special congregational meeting for *Sunday, July 27 at 10:15 am* for the purpose of calling a new pastor and will be the only business conducted at this meeting.


The Call Committee has identified a candidate for Lead Pastor at Saint Andrew and is looking forward to presenting the candidate to the congregation for call.

Under synodical guidelines, the Call Committee may not identify the candidate until the meeting on July 27. Any identifying information will not be disclosed before that time.

Per our constitution, authority to call a pastor shall be in this congregation by at least a two-thirds vote of voting members present and voting at a meeting legally called for that purpose. Voting proxy or absentee ballots will not be permitted.

Eligible voters are: participating members who have been confirmed, have made a financial contribution of record and have communed at Saint Andrew this past calendar year.

Please plan to attend this important meeting!



Marketing Campaign Update

I am already putting your marketing contributions to work — with the support and blessing of the pastor we are considering for call.

As of this moment, I have received enough funds to commit to 12 weeks of billboards in various locations around the community to begin on August 4.

I have been able to commit to 10 ads in Wausau Pilot and Review in their email addition that is sent to $\sim 30,000$ area households. They will be identical to the billboards. That will begin in mid-August.

Soon I will commit to a mailing to every home in zip codes 54401 and 54403 which will be set for mid- to late- September.

I always tell leaders that we will do as much as people provide funds for us to do.

I would like to send a second mailing but that is expensive. I would like to do something on social media. I would have done more with billboards but the physical sights I wanted were mostly already taken.

In my last conversation with our prospective pastor, I asked if he wanted me to slow things down and wait for him to make decisions. He said no. He asked that everything continue apace as planned.

So, that is how I will proceed. As we put things in motion to prepare for a second Sunday morning worship service, we do so also in preparation for the arrival of a new pastor. It is an exciting time to be part of the Saint Andrew community!


From the SALC Library

"The Vanishing Half" - by Brit Bennett

The Virginia sisters will always be identical. But after growing up together in a small, southern black community and running away at sixteen, it's not just the shape of their daily lives that is different as adults, it's everything, including their racial identities. Many years later, one sister lives with her black

daughter in the same town she once tried to escape. Across the country, the other secretly passes for white, and her white husband knows nothing of her past.

Weaving together multiple strands and generations, The "Vanishing Half" is at once a riveting, emotional family story and a brilliant exploration of race, gender, and identity, and the lasting influence of the past as it shapes a person's desires and expectations.



"The Night Watchman" - by Louise Erdrich

Based on the extraordinary life of the author's grandfather, Patrick Gourneau, who worked as a night watchman and carried the fight against Native disposition from rural North Dakota all the way to Washington, D.C. this powerful novel explores themes of love and death with lightness and gravity, and unfolds with the elegant prose, sly humor, and depth of feeling of a literary master.

Thomas Wazhashk is a Chippewa council member who is trying to understand the consequences of a new "emancipation" bill on its way to the floor of the United States Congress. He and the other council members know the bill isn't about freedom: congress is fed up with Indians. The bill is a "termination" that threatens the rights of Native Americans to their land and their very identity. How can the government abandon treaties made in good faith with Native Americans "for as long as the grasses will grow and the rivers run?"


