2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly July 28-August 2

The 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly will be held at the Phoenix Convention Center in Phoenix, Ariz. I was elected as a delegate to the CWA at the 2024 Synod Assembly along with 12 other members from the East Central Synod of Wisconsin. I am honored and blessed to participate in this churchwide event. The CWA convenes every three years.

The ELCA Churchwide Assembly, the primary decision-making body of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, is a process of communal spiritual discernment. When the assembly convenes, its voting members meet with confidence in God's grace around word and water, wine and bread, to carry on their work on behalf of the entire church. Over the course of the assembly, voting members:

- Hear reports and review the work of churchwide officers, leaders and units.
- Receive and consider proposals from synod assemblies.
- Elect officers, board members and other leaders as specified by the constitution or bylaws. This year it includes electing a new presiding Bishop.
- Establish ELCA churchwide policy.
- Worship together.
- Adopt a budget.
- Conduct other business related to the ELCA churchwide organization.

After I return (and recover from the heat) I will provide a summary of the assembly and a few thoughts about the process and the event. Keep me and the other delegates in your thoughts and prayers as we do God's work through our hands.

of using a lathe and turning raw wood into something useful and artistic. Great for anyone curious about hands-on craftsmanship! Potluck lunch to follow.


Confirmation 2025-2026


"Infinite Country" - by Patricia Engel

Talia is being held at a correctional facility for adolescent girls in the forested mountains of Columbia after committing an impulsive act of violence that may or may not have been warranted. She urgently needs to get out and get back home to Bogota where her father and a plane ticket to the United States are waiting for her.

Rich with Bogota urban life, steeped in Andean myth, and tense with the daily reality of the undocumented in the United States, "Infinite Country" is the story of two countries and one mixed-status family - for whom every triumph is stitched with regret, and every dream pursued bears the eight of a dream deferred.

Life is a lucrative business, as long as you play by the rules. Nestled in New York's Hudson Valley is a luxury retreat boating every amenity: organic meals, personal fitness trainers, daily massages—and all of it for free. 
Saint Andrew Spending Plan Monthly Update
